Company Timeline



1996

In March 1996, Banora International Group (BIG) was developed as the International arm of Banora Travel, a retail travel agency located in Banora Point on the border of NSW and QLD. Originally, the inbound division coordinated weddings, fishing tours, tailored itineraries for Tweed and Gold Coast, golf and scuba tours as well as student study tours.



1998

After a partnership split, the company choses to strengthen its niche skills in the student market, developing the brand Education by Recreation, EbR creating tailor-made programs that take learning outside the classroom while combining student friendly tourism products, homestay and learning.



2002

Recognised as a professional homestay service provider, Banora International Group was encouraged to separate their homestay product under a separate identity enabling competitors to contract BIGs homestay services.



2004

Realising that tourists with little time did not have the opportunity to include homestay into their itinerary, Aussie Home Visit was developed so all visitors to Australia could have a 100% immersion experience in our culture.



2010

After being a client of AFT, a national farm host and agricultural company for 10 years, BIG won the tender to purchase AFT. The merge has enabled BIG to establish policies and procedures in line with national standards, developing a stronger presence in Asian markets and increased the number of product available to clients.



2014

After many years of coordinating ad-hoc volunteer programs and internships, Banora International Group created Study'n Volunteer Australia (SVA). SVA is dedicated to building a better future, encouraging self-awareness and stimulating a positive contribution to the community.



2019

Identifying a need in the International student industry for a product to assist International students that are struggling to find their way to adjust to a new environment, language and culture. BIG partnered with AusIDentities to provide students with a unique personality profiling application that will improve their opportunities and experiences whilst in Australia.



2019

Following the release of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, BIG identified a need to provide programs with a deeper purpose that were outcome focused. This resulted in our new academic division which promotes sustainability and positively influences the leaders of our future.



2020

COVID-19 closed our borders forcing the cancellation of thousands of students on our study tour, homestay, farmstay and internship programs. Our programs are once in a lifetime experiences, so we felt it necessary to somehow deliver a similar experience. We created Great Barrier Reef Academy, a virtual online education platform incorporating education webinars, live interactive edu-tourism options and intercultural experiences.

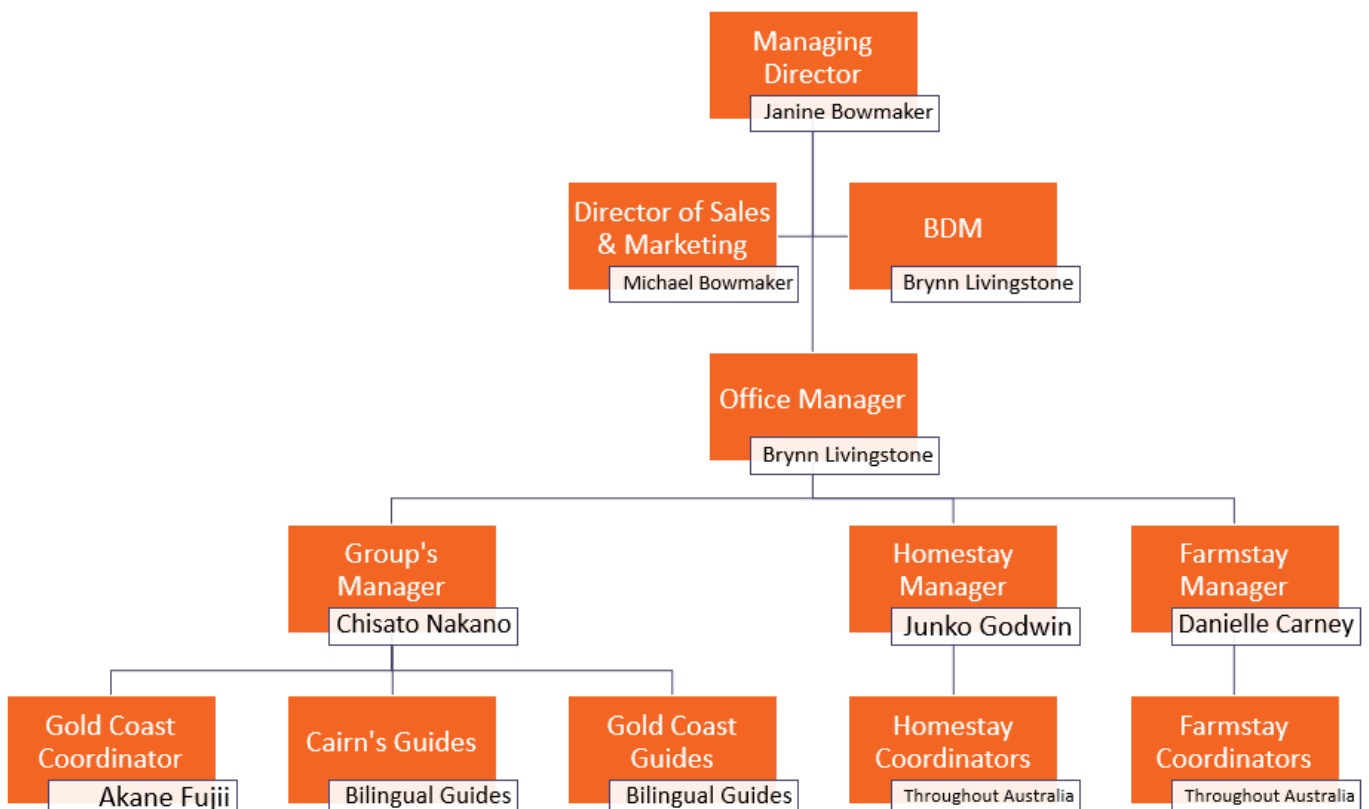
